


# MATHS PUZZLE OF THE WEEK




The answer for last week's puzzle was ... 100 cm squared Well done to all those who attempted the puzzle.

if you can't fly, run If you can't run, walk If you can't walk, crawl But by all means, keep moving" Well done Annabelle Z. "




# **CONGRATULATIONS TO ...**
