The HMC Chess Championships took place at QEGS Wakefield on Tuesday 15th November. It was an early start, with the bus setting off from school at 7:15am. We had 36 players, with 5 teams of 4 in the U11 section, and 4 teams of 4 in the U9 competition.

I am delighted to say that we did really well. We managed to win both trophies! In the U11 section, RGS A scored 20.5/24 for outright first. They won all 6 matches. 2 of them by a 4-0 score. Bruce L and Ethan R both received a certificate for finishing with a perfect 6/6. Yannick H scored 5/6.

The B team finished in outright second position with 16.5/24. This was a great achievement, especially as there were 19 teams in the competition. Well done to Yogam V for scoring 5/6. Krish A scored 4.5 points and George M finished on 4. Hebo W scored 5 points for the C team; Aodham D 4 for the D team; and Aayur P 4 for the E team.

Being a Chorister is proven to help develop fast reading skills, problem solving and concentration. There are also physical benefits, as well as the joy that comes from working cooperatively as part of an exclusive team. Gaining professional musical skills from an early age is wonderful preparation for later life – for university and beyond.

Boys and girls (Years 3 to 9) attend rehearsals at the Cathedral on 2 nights a week after school. After some experience has been gained there is also a Sunday service. 
